

Meine Beiträge zum Projekt referieren auf historische berlinbezogene Pressefotografien aufgelöster Arbeitsarchive ausländischer Tageszeitungen und Wochenmagazine. Die von mir ortszugängen ausgewählten Fotografien und Texte, die aktuelle Ereignisse der Vergangenheit beschreiben, habe ich digital bearbeitet, um sie in diesen neuen öffentlichen Kontext zu bringen. Die Bilder bewegen sich im Spannungsfeld scheinbar aktueller und

gleichzeitig vergangener Bild- und Textwelten an einem ungewöhnlichen Ort. Die Zuordnung und Auflösung der Irritation wird den Wartenden am Bahnsteig überlassen.



Children carrying a banner urging support of the National Front candidates okayed by the Soviet bosses lead a line of voters to the polls. No opposition was permitted in the election of a new People's Chamber, whose function is to rubber stamp actions of the Communist government in Eastern Germany. A single list of candidates made it a clinch. The sign says: "We tenants of Strausberger Platz, 15 to 10, vote for the candidates of the National Front."







# kunst-im-untergrund.de

Beim diesjährigen Wettbewerb für Kunst im Untergrund, NACH DER ARBEIT, gab es 380 Einreichungen, also mehr als doppelt so viele wie im letzten Jahr. Der Großteil der Bewerbungen von Künstler\_innen verschiedenster Nationalitäten erreichte uns aus Berlin. Doch auch aus dem übrigen Europa, aus Australien, Japan, Kanada und den USA kamen viele Einsendungen. Das Preisgericht hat insgesamt 13 Entwürfe zur Realisierung vorgeschlagen, die ortsspezifisch und thematisch arbeiten. In der ersten Realisierungsphase können nun mit 7 Beiträgen auf 10 Berliner U-Bahnhöfen die vielfältigen Möglichkeiten betrachtet werden, die sich im künstlerischen Umgang mit dem Medium Plakat entfalten.
